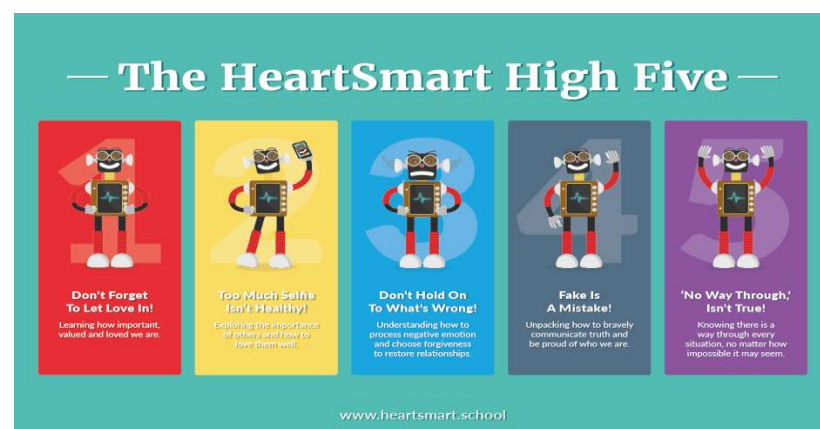


## PSHE and RRE at Old Basing Infant School

This convention identifies the rights that all children have with regards to safety, health, religion, education and security. As a Rights Respecting Gold school, this convention is applied to all our learning and delivered as part of all we do; although it has a stronger focus within PSHE and RE units of work. We use Heartsmart which is an online PSHE learning tool. It covers a range of topics based around the Heartsmart High Five. Each year group has a series of lessons which will be enhanced by our Rights Respecting Curriculum. Each year group chooses their own campaign which they hope will have an impact on the community and in developing them as global citizens. In April 2021 Relationships Education and Health Education became statutory for all schools. At Old Basing Infant School we implement the objectives set out in the guidance through units of learning such as Health and Safety, Mental Health and Well-being, Friendship and Resilience.
